

Disciplinary Infractions/Consequences 2023–2024

This table outlines the general structure for disciplinary offenses and their consequences. *The table is a partial listing intended as a guideline and does not preclude the administration from responding to conduct that is deemed inappropriate to the school setting in a manner other than as set forth below.* The administration reserves the right to respond with consequences consistent with state and federal law taking into account factors such as the student's involvement with prior disciplinary incidents, severity of the infraction, and other information relevant to the situation. The disciplinary system is intended to be progressive in its approach and restorative practices may be incorporated into remediation. Accordingly, repeated offenses will receive escalating consequences as determined appropriate by the administration and consistent with Board of Education policy. Repeated offenses and/or patterns of misbehavior may also result in the withholding of privileges, including but not limited to: parking on campus, early dismissal/late arrival, attending school functions, and participating in extracurricular activities. The discipline code applies at all school related events and activities, both on and off campus.
